Pursuant to California Rule of Court 2.812, to serve as a court appointed temporary judge an attorney must meet the following experience and conditions:

- Admitted to practice as member of the State Bar of California for at least 10 years before appointment;
- Is a member in good standing of the State Bar and has no disciplinary action pending;
- Has not pled guilty or no contest to a felony, or has not been convicted of a felony that has not been reversed; and
- Has satisfied all education and training requirements per Rule 2.812(c).

Training required pursuant to California Rule of Court 2.812(c) before serving as temporary judges includes:

- Bench conduct and demeanor (in-person training);
- Ethics; and
- Substantive training in specific bench assignment (e.g., small claims, traffic).
